Getting to Know: Emily Herron

Emily Herron looks like a savant in her log book, soloing after about 2 hours of official training at 17 years old. But she had already spent those 17 years growing up around her family's 1946 Piper J-3 Cub. Purchased by her grandfather in 1949 for around \$700, he never would have imagined that it would have the lasting legacy that it did for their family 72 years later.

Emily learned how to fly from her father as she was growing up in NW Florida. She moved to Kentucky when she was in college and completed her private pilot's license at 29. Currently she works as an airport manager, but is also well versed in the fabric work of recovering planes like the family Cub. She is an avid pilot, mom to Will, and wife of Seth.

When talking about family history, Emily and her father realized how unique it was that they had owned the Cub for over 70 years and decided to plan the historic trip to the 15 different airports it had been based out of over the years. The bright yellow taildragger cruises at about 80mph so the adventure would take a while to do together. INTERNATIONAL FOREST OF FRIENDSHIP

The International Forest of Friendship is an arboretum and memorial forest beside Lake Warnock in Atchison, Kansas. A life-size bronze statue of Amelia Earhart gazes over the International Forest of Friendship, which is a living, growing memorial to those who have been involved in aviation and space exploration. The forest was established as a bicentennial project by the City of Atchison and The Ninety-Nines Inc., an international organization of women pilots.

Each June, new honorees are inducted into the forest with plaques embedded in the walkway that winds through trees representing all 50 states and over 36 countries in which 1,500 forest honorees reside. Several special trees include the "Moon Tree," which was grown from a seed taken to the moon aboard Apollo 14.
